 - South Korea's national dish is kimchi, which is a combination of vegetables and spices that have been fermented underground for months. True
 - Korean martial art taekwondo is the country's most famous sport.
 True It literally means "the way of the fist and foot."

Cambodia #26

What is the capital? Phnom Penh

- The largest religious structure ever built is Angkor Wat (City Temple) in Cambodia. -True
 - Tarantulas are eaten in Cambodia as a snack. –True Apparently, the "legs are pleasantly crunchy".

Laos #27
